


The **Heart Rhythm** Society invites you to the **HEART** of Denver to learn all about heart health

- Sudden cardiac arrest (SCA) and atrial fibrillation (AFib) are the two most common types of heart rhythm disorders
- AFib affects more than2.5 million people
- If left untreated, AFib can increase the risk of stroke fivefold
- SCA claims more than 350,000 lives each year (more than breast cancer, lung cancer, or AIDS) and often strikes without warning
- 65% of people don't know the difference between
 SCA and a heart attack
